Task Force update – Thanks to the AAA for their participation and comments. Public safety has also been involved in the discussions. Next meeting is Thursday. Upcoming discussion of “bump-outs” into the street along the West side of Atlantic Ave. between 17th-24th street. Some concern about non- year-round business owners along Atlantic Ave have the opportunity to set up in the bump-out area. Suggestion to keep the area for parking. Idea if we want art along the Atlantic, but more like a café on the sidewalk, not as a bump-out.

Atlantic upgrades - looking at uniform lighting, signage, and more enforcement of codes, will have 71 parking spots on Atlantic

6. Parking Update – Chuck Cayton – looking to create a coordinated parking and mobility system. (See handout). Garret Berger (Runnymede – member of TPPC of RAC), John Crawford new parking manager for the City. Central Resort Area had major parking issues.
 - a. Core Recommendations – empower the Parking Dept to develop new technology and flexibility to figure out mobility and parking in the Resort Area – includes working with private parking owners

8. Public Safety Update – Looking ahead to when warmer days and folks start coming out of the woodwork. Ask businesses to call the non-emergency number if you see folks gathering or if you see social media or flyers encouraging gatherings. Trespass enforcement existed years ago, but went away. Public Safety is looking to bring it back (via a letter or agreement with Public Safety)

to allow them to enforce trespassing. Building out specialty squads – in the process of building them out. During the off-season, they sometimes move to other areas (narcotics, schools, etc). Discussion regarding response time during off season. Was explained that the departments are still short of officers. Working on hiring to full staff.

10. City of Norfolk Grants – Economic Development – AAG – Atlantic Ave Matching Grant – City will match 50% of what you spend. Must spend \$20K-\$50K. Performance-based grant (get the grant after work is done.) Recommendation to lower the threshold – many businesses don't have the \$20K to spend, would be nice to have a spend \$6K, get \$3K.

Façade Grant – City-wide, but not including Atlantic Ave – Atlantic Ave directed to AAG grant.

In 2023, Shaun was diagnosed with Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia/Small Lymphocytic Lymphoma (CLL/SLL), an aggressive form marked by the worst prognostic mutations, and in early 2025 his cancer transformed into the rare and highly aggressive Richter's Transformation (Diffuse Large B-Cell Lymphoma). Since then, Shaun has endured multiple intensive treatments, including chemo-immunotherapy, targeted therapies, radiation, and preparation for advanced options such as CAR-T therapy and a life-saving stem cell transplant—his best chance at long-term survival. While some treatments have shown encouraging signs, his journey remains uncertain and ongoing, requiring frequent hospital visits, complex care, and significant financial strain. Through it all, Shaun is supported by his wife Sarah, a full-time store manager and caregiver, and their two children, Madelyn and Henry. A Marine Corps veteran and longtime Virginia Beach Police K-9 handler, Shaun's cancer is linked to burn-pit exposure during his military service, and his aggressive illness may force early medical retirement. Please keep Shaun and his family in your prayers as they continue this fight together.
